Gratulujemy serdecznie trzem staszycowskim Drużynom, które – niepodważalną decyzją

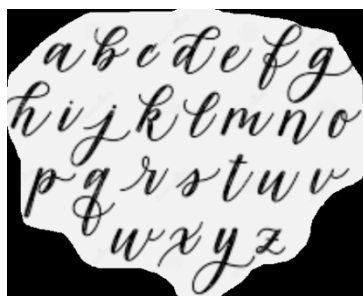

Uncover your inner elocutionist

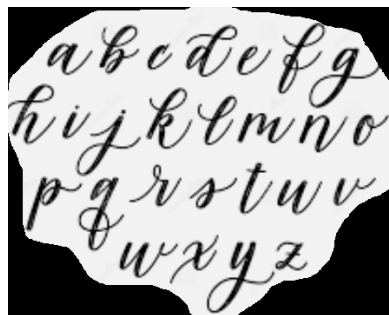

mourning your old habits.

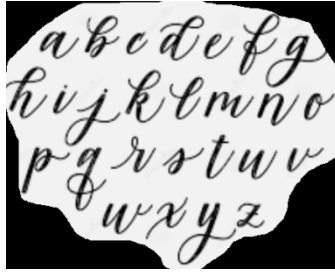
